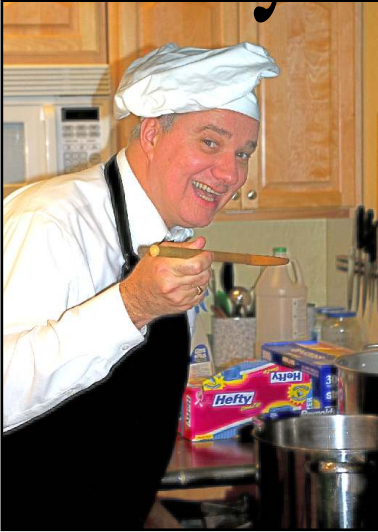

A Few Facts. . .

The Life Insurance Market Research Association has published the following 5 facts.

Fact 1: Nearly 75% of North Americans agree that life insurance is the best way to protect against premature death of the primary wage earner.
